

## ***MISSION***

The ADDE program is designed to engage participants who have been arrested for an alcohol or drug related (non-driving) offense by increasing awareness and promoting education on alcohol and other drugs. The ADDE Program utilizes an education based model allowing for increased awareness while holding offenders responsible for their choices.



## ***OVERVIEW***

The ADDE Program is a voluntary pretrial program that is offered to individuals, ages 16 and older, who have been arrested for alcohol/drug related violation(s) and or misdemeanor(s) that are non-driving offenses.

The ADDE Program seeks to provide early intervention and education utilizing the *Prime For Life* drug and alcohol education program.

The ADDE Program is designed to achieve its mission as quickly as possible. The average program length is 90-120 days. Upon successful completion of the program, most often, criminal charges will be reduced or dismissed.

## ***REQUIRED COMPONENTS***

- \$400.00 program fee (\$100 due upon admission)
- 12 hours of alcohol and drug education (*Prime for Life*)
- Correctional facility tour or Operation Impact Program plus a 250 word essay of the experience
- 8 hours of community service
- Drug/Alcohol testing with a minimum of four (4) consecutive clean drug tests
- Weekly meetings with a Case Manager

## ***ADDITIONAL COMPONENTS BASED ON INDIVIDUAL BASIS***

- Screening, evaluation and/or counseling with a Licensed Alcohol and Drug Counselor
- Utilization of community based AA/NA meetings

## ***DIRECTIONS***

Coming from the East (Manchester)

Take Elm Street to W. Bridge Street, W. Bridge Street becomes Amory Street, turn slight right onto Coolidge Ave., turn left onto Kelly Street, Kelly Street becomes Nazaire Biron Bridge, Nazaire Biron Bridge becomes Pinard Street, turn right onto Mast Road/NH 114A, continue to follow Mast Road, 329 Mast Road is on the right-hand side. If you come to the NH State Prison for women, you have passed the building.

Coming from the South

Take NH-101A, look for the Everett Turnpike North ramp toward Manchester/Concord, merge onto Everett Turnpike (portions toll) merge onto NH-101 W toward US-3/Bedford/RT-114/Milford, take NH-114 toward Goffstown/Henniker, turn left onto NH-114/Mast Road, 329 Mast Road is on the right-hand side. If you come to the NH State Prison for women, you have passed the building.

Coming from the West

Take US-202/ NH-101 continue to follow NH-101, turn right to stay on NH-101, turn left onto NH-114, turn left onto NH-114/Mast Road, continue along and 329 Mast Road is on the right-hand side. If you come to the NH State Prison for women, you have passed the building.
